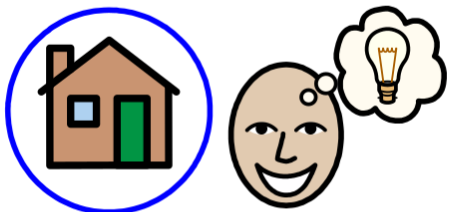

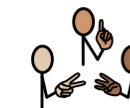

- ◇ Board games support turn taking skills and developing social cues.
- ◇ Colouring is an engaging way to observe and practice pencil control and pressure.
- ◇ Sharing 'news' through the use of class dojo images sent supports children with conversational skills .
- ◇ Singing nursery rhymes supports early language and communication development, build confidence and prepare children for reading and writing as they progress.
- ◇ Playing eye spy but with phonetic sounds (i.e. something beginning with /a/ being apple) supports initial sound recognition .
- ◇ Baking/cooking supports instruction following, mathematical measurement skills and is a lovely sensory and bonding experience. This can also help children to explore food and become more adventurous with widening their palette.
- ◇ Shopping, café visits and similar activities are brilliant life skills .
- ◇ Reading to your child boosts brain development, vocabulary, and language skills. It prepares children for academic success by building cognitive skills, imagination, and concentration.

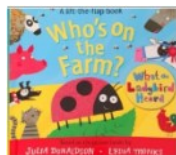
